



KEY POLICY AREAS FOR OIA IN 2022 & MOVING FORWARD

01

Recreation/infrastructure funding at the state & local level

Advocate for recreation funding prioritizing close-to-home access, as well as increased green infrastructure in nature-starved areas. Continue and expand advocacy to protect public lands of all types and fund recreation amenities to meet increased consumer/participant need

Climate & conservation

Track major developments in the America the Beautiful initiative.

Understand state-level 30x30 efforts and understand best practices.

Further explore industry's role in the initiative; continue advocacy for climate, nature based solutions, and conservation. Ensure industry's voice is harmonized and amplified in supporting efforts around the 30x30 goal. Advocate on climate and conservation/natural climate solutions policy

KEY POLICY AREAS FOR OIA IN 2022 & MOVING FORWARD



Support the development of an outdoors for all

Focus on research of existing state-based outdoor equity programs: short-comings, and opportunities to scale. Develop a campaign around equity funds for OIA, members, and partners (SOBAN, etc) to promote. Study and address equity and accessibility challenges. Expand advocacy on state and federal policies for funding and programs that create an outdoors for all
